



- 1 in 9 U.S. Residents

Children of Immigrants are ...


- 1 in 5 Children

- Post 9/11: Economic Downturn


Key Federal Policy Choices

- Health benefits: ICHIA
- Low-income workers: WIA
- Undocumented students: DREAM
- Schooling: NCLB \$
- Pre-school: reauthorization of Head Start

Poverty Widespread Children of Immigrants under 6

- 56% live in families with income under 200% of poverty
- Children of immigrants are 29% of all low-income young children
- 63% of young foreign-born children live in families with income under 200% of poverty


Almost All Kids < 6 Are Citizens in Mixed Families

- 90% under age 6 are citizens (versus 70% ages 6 to 17)
- 79% under age 6 have a noncitizen parent
- 28% under age 6 have an undocumented immigrant parent

Many Parents Arrived Recently

- 50% of parents arrived within the last ten years
- 20% arrived within the last 5 years
- Many parents are ineligible for public benefits

Many Parents Have Little Formal Schooling



Parents have less than 9th grade education


Parents have 9th grade, but no high school diploma



Share of Children under 6 in Families with Incomes Below 200% of Poverty




Share uninsured

More LEP Children are Native than Foreign-Born




Distribution of Limited English Proficient Students in Grades K-12
